# Elizabeth (Liz) Nimmo

Liz Nimmo was President of the PEI Kiwanis Music Festival from 1993 – 1996.

Liz and her husband Jim moved to PEI in the summer of 1982 and became involved in the music scene as choristers, soloists and Music Festival supporters.

We remember Liz as a volunteer who gave her time, talent and expertise to both the Provincial festival, and the Kings County Music Festival, for which she was a Board Director right up until her passing in October 2023.

We fondly remember her as a generous and caring music supporter.

# Dr. Gregory B. Irvine



Gregory Irvine was an outstanding musician and teacher who was a huge part of our music festivals at local, provincial, and national levels for many years, as teacher, adjudicator, and committee member. As well as volunteering with festival committees, Greg held the post of Associate Professor of Brass in the Music Department at the University of Prince Edward Island for 29 years until his retirement in 2019. He also performed regularly with the PEI Symphony Orchestra, and other orchestras in Atlantic Canada, and was well known for his great love of both teaching and playing.

Greg was the husband of our most recent Past President, Sue Irvine. His passing is a great loss to his family, friends, students, to all of us who knew him, and to the whole PEI music community. The following section of a tribute posted by the UPEI Music Department sums up perfectly how well-loved Greg was by everyone who knew him, and the legacy that he leaves behind.

"A fine musician and pedagogue, Greg will be fondly remembered for his cheery disposition, wonderful sense of humour, and genuine concern for others. His legacy will live on through the fine brass playing of his students and successive generations of musicians who will perpetuate a tradition of excellence in brass pedagogy and performance rooted in the simple yet powerful concept of 'Song and Wind'.

Dr. Stephen Runge

Principal adjudicator for Piano and Organ



Praised for his sensitivity and versatility, pianist Stephen Runge has been heard from Victoria to Halifax as soloist and collaborative artist, receiving special recognition for his frequent performances of chamber music and art song. Holding a Doctorate of Music in Piano Performance from l'Université de Montréal, Stephen has recorded all the major works for solo piano by Robert Schumann and is in demand as teacher, adjudicator, and clinician.

Born and raised in Regina, Saskatchewan, Stephen is on faculty in the Department of Music at Mount Allison University in Sackville, New Brunswick, where he is currently Head of Music, Professor of Piano, and Director of Mount Allison Local Centre Examinations in Music.

In recognition of his outstanding teaching, research, creative activities, and service, Mount Allison awarded him a Paul Paré Excellence Award in 2010, the J.E.A. Crake Award for excellence in teaching in the Faculty of Arts in 2014, and the Paul Paré Medal in 2020.

Prior to this, he served as a Professor of Music and led the wind and brass studies department at Cambrian College and served on the conducting faculty of Laurentian University in Sudbury, Ontario. Maddix is active on the boards of the Newfoundland and Labrador Band Association and the Canadian Band Association.

He also hosts "The Band Room Podcast" and the conducting leadership podcast "Changing Your Pattern."

Maddix holds a Bachelor of Music degree from Mount Allison University, a Master of Music degree in Trumpet Performance from the University of Toronto, and a Doctorate of Musical Arts degree in Conducting from Arizona State University.
