## Kings County Music Festival Adjudicators, 2024

### Keira Galway

Vocal and Musical Theatre Adjudicator



Educator, choral conductor and musician Kiera Galway was born and raised in St. John's, Newfoundland. She was an active member of music communities in both St. John's and Toronto as a choral conductor, educator, bassoonist and administrator. Her educational journey includes degrees in bassoon performance, musicology and music education from Memorial University and the University of Toronto.

Kiera joined the faculty at Mount Allison University in Sackville, New Brunswick as Assistant Professor of Music Education and Choral Conducting in 2020, where she directs the university choirs and teaches courses in music education, ensemble leadership, conducting and music history.

As a researcher, Kiera's interests include place-informed approaches to music education, and her teaching prioritizes student-centred approaches that centre on connection and collaboration.

### **Glen Montgomery**

Piano Adjudicator



Glen Montgomery has led a most diverse life musically succeeding to maintain a dynamic performing career while establishing a reputation as one of Canada's most successful teachers over the past decades. From Australia to Iceland, the USA and Russia, Montgomery has played over 30 concertos with major orchestras, collaborated with artists such as Lynn Harrell, Nina Beilina, James Campbell, Joel Quarrington, Frances Ginzer, Paul Brodie, James Somerville, John de Lancie, Jose Luis Garcia and countless others, and recorded for CBC, PBS, Belarus TV and Radio and Analekta.

Professor Montgomery over the years was on faculty at the Banff Centre, University of Ottawa, and University of Lethbridge (26 years) as well as the Conservatory of Music at Mount Royal University as Distinguished Teacher in Piano and Chamber Music. His extensive list of highly successful students includes: Stephen Nguyen, Carlos Foggin, Vivian Lou, Kyuyoung Park and Jan Lisiecki. He has coached outstanding instrumentalists: Arnold Choi, Nikki Chooi, Annalee Patipatankoon, Tate Zawadiuk and many others. Equally, Mr. Montgomery delights in the careers of his students who continue to cherish music, while prospering in medicine, engineering, law, education, journalism, etc. His students have ranged in age from three to 87 and he continues to value teaching people of all experiences who simply seek beauty and awakening through the discovery of music.

In the past several years Glen Montgomery has also developed a fine reputation as a composer, writing works for choir, solo piano, and chamber music. His major composition, Masques of Canada, premiered at the 2017 Festival of the Sound.

### Nicole Strum

Band and Instrumental Adjudicator



Saxophonist and educator Nicole Strum is a multifaceted musician: she is equally at home interpreting new works and collaborating with composers, teaching courses in music theory and aural skills, directing ensembles and facilitating chamber music workshops, and coaching woodwind players. As a performer, she has been praised for her expressive voice and the intensity of her interpretations; as a studio teacher, her commitment to guiding students to discover their unique musical identity is recognized by her colleagues.

Nicole is a member of two duos focused on contemporary music: with flautist Liesel Deppe she formed Feldsperling Duo, and premiered commissioned works at Arrayspace in Toronto and on the Canadian East Coast. Following their debut at Halifax's Open Waters New Music Festival, the Strum-De Borba duo, with saxophonist Tristan De Borba, capped a 2019 mini-series of performances with a faculty residency at the Lunenburg Academy of Music Performance for its inaugural Saxophone Academy.

Other performance highlights include appearances at the North American Saxophone Alliance's Regional and Biennial conferences, the World Saxophone Congress, the Society for Composers Inc. Region 10 Conference, the UNCG New Music Festival, Mount Allison University's Recital Series, the Transitio\_MX Festival Internacional de Artes Electrónicas in Mexico City, and as concerto soloist with the UPEI Wind Symphony.

Nicole has taught music theory at Kwantlen University and UBC. In 2022 she was Visiting Assistant Professor of Single Reeds and Conducting at Mount Allison University, and was the Woodwind Specialist for Halifax Regional Arts in Nova Scotia the year prior. Currently she is on faculty at the University of Prince Edward Island where she teaches saxophone and aural skills. She adjudicates at local and national music festivals, leads workshops and clinics, and coordinates UPEI Summer Studios, a week-long chamber music workshop for advanced young musicians.

Nicole holds a performance diploma from the Bordeaux Conservatory, where she studied with renowned French saxophonist Marie-Bernadette Charrier, and a DMA and Certificate of Music Theory Pedagogy from the University of North Carolina, Greensboro.

### **TROPHIES, AWARDS AND SCHOLARSHIPS**

To qualify for a festival award or scholarship, a solo contestant (except Pre-Juniors) must compete in more than one class in the same discipline when there is a provision of suitable classes in the same discipline from which to choose. To be eligible for an award, competitors must attain an average of at least 85% based on their top two marks or be recommended by the adjudicator for an award. Awards may be given to those attaining the highest marks in Sight Reading, Quick Study, Duet and Trio Classes in any discipline. Special Festival Awards may be given upon the recommendation of the adjudicators. All awards will not necessarily be given in any one year.

Conditions for Bursary as follows:

1. Solo performers graduating from high school who intend to make music a career are eligible.

2. This scholarship is open to residents of Kings County Music Festival area.

3. Performers must apply, in writing; the applicant's career goals, Music Festival experience and other relevant information should be included.

4. Those applying must be competing in the current annual Festival.

5. Applicants must achieve a mark of 85% or over to be eligible for this scholarship.

6. The scholarship will be awarded on the recommendation of the adjudicator in consultation with the Award Committee.

7. The scholarship shall be in the amount of \$600.00.

8. If sufficient funds are available, more than one scholarship may be given. If more than one person is eligible, this scholarship may be divided.

9. This scholarship is given for future tuition and related expenses. Payment will be made to accredited music schools. Special circumstances for study will be considered.

10. The scholarship will be presented following acceptance and registration in an accredited music program. The scholarship must be used within three years from date of presentation unless an extension is arranged with the Association.

11. Scholarship need not be presented every year.

12. Conditions of the scholarship may be subject to change from year to year.

13. APPLICATIONS MUST BE RECEIVED BY APRIL 15 OF THE CURRENT YEAR.

## **Local and Provincial Festival Regulations**

The Provincial Festival Board is responsible for creating and enforcing the regulations contained herein. The regulations govern all four affiliated local festivals, as well as the provincial festival. The purpose of the regulations is to ensure that:

(i) PEI festivals adhere to common standards;

and

(ii) festival competitions are conducted in a fair and equitable manner.

Contestants, teachers, and parents are responsible for reading and complying with the regulations and entering the correct classes; non-compliance may result in disqualification. For the purpose of festival competition, disqualification means the contestant will receive a written adjudication only (they will not be eligible to receive any award)

#### Adjudication system:

- 1. The adjudication system of the Prince Edward Island Kiwanis Music Festival Association is designed to recognize each participant for his or her own individual performance.
- 2. Whether the classes are competitive or non-competitive, each performance is adjudicated according to its own merit and not in comparison with others.
- 3. Each participant will receive positive instruction and encouragement.
- 4. A gold, silver or bronze seal will be added to the adjudication sheet reflecting the standard achieved for that particular performance. This standard is pre-determined by the adjudicator.

The marks represented by the seals are as follows:

- Gold 88 or above,
- Silver 84-87,
- Bronze 80-83.

The mark itself will not be made public and is used solely in deciding final awards.

## Adjudicators' decisions must be accepted as final. Contestants, teachers and parents are prohibited from approaching the adjudicator to discuss these issues.

#### Eligibility:

- 1. The PEI music festivals shall be open to <u>non-professionals</u> who are (i) Canadian citizens; or (ii) living or studying in the province.
- 2. A "non-professional" is defined as a person whose principal means of livelihood is not obtained from the performance of music in the particular discipline in which he or she is competing. Musicians who are members of ACTRA, Equity or the American Federation of Musicians of the United States and Canada (AFM/AFofM) are considered to be professional. A competitor who qualifies as a professional for the purpose of a particular discipline may enter as an amateur in other disciplines.
- 3. Music Festival contestants should compete in their designated home festival. For the purpose of these regulations, "home festival" is defined as the local festival that operates in the contestant's place of residence and/or study. Contestants who wish to compete in an alternate local festival must submit a

request in writing to the <u>Provincial Administrator</u> (<u>pei.kiwanismusicfestival@gmail.com</u>) prior to the entry deadline, stating the reason for the request.

#### Disciplines and age / level categories:

In the provincial festival, the disciplines are as follows:

- Vocal
- Musical Theatre
- Piano
- Strings
- Woodwind
- Brass
- Percussion
- Organ
- Guitar
- Choral

\* Please note that some of these disciplines may not be offered in some local festivals. Please consult your local festival's addendum if you are unsure.

#### Age categories:

At the <u>Provincial Festival</u>, the age categories for all disciplines are as follows:

- Junior 11 years and under
- Intermediate 14 years and under
- Senior 17 years and under
- Advanced 30 years and under

In local festivals, some additional disciplines and age levels are listed in this syllabus, including:

- Pre-Junior (8 years and under) to adult.
- Graded and Non-Age limited classes
- 1. Only performers fulfilling the official Junior, Intermediate, Senior, and Advanced categories are eligible to be recommended to progress to the Provincial Festival.
- The age of a contestant in all classes shall be considered as of DECEMBER 31<sup>st</sup> of the previous calendar year.
- 3. Eligibility requirements for local festival awards and scholarships are determined by the local festival organizing committees. Contestants are advised to consult their local festival addendum for the rules specific to their festival.
- 4. A solo contestant entering a specific age category in a discipline must remain in that age category throughout the classes offered in the discipline.
- 5. A contestant entering a specific graded category in a discipline must remain in that graded category throughout the classes offered in the discipline.
- 6. A solo contestant who has won the provincial class in his/her age category and discipline for three consecutive years must advance to the next age category in that discipline the following festival year. This does not preclude the contestant from competing in the lower age category in another discipline in the same local festival.

#### Festival scheduling:

Special scheduling requests cannot be guaranteed to be accepted, but an urgent request should be made at the time of entry to:

- to the local festival coordinator or programmer (for local festivals)
- to the festival administrator (for the provincial festival)

#### **Selection choices:**

- 1. Original copies of music for own-choice selections must be supplied by contestants. The class number and contestant number must be clearly marked for the adjudicator. The first bar of each line must be numbered.
- 2. The standard and suitability of own-choice selections will be given due consideration by the adjudicators.
- 3. A "concerted work" is defined as any composition originally written for solo instrument with orchestral /band accompaniment.

#### Performance regulations:

- 1. Repeats in the score are generally omitted; however, the repetition of short sections may be observed to preserve the structure of the composition. All Da Capo and Dal Segno markings must be observed.
- 2. In all vocal classes, including choral classes, transposition one full tone up or down is permitted.
- 3. Memory work is encouraged in all festivals. No specific number of marks is allotted for memory work; memorized performances, however, will be given due consideration by the adjudicators.
- 4. Contestants must provide their own accompanists and are responsible for any related costs incurred.
- 5. Long oral introductions in solo classes are not permitted in any discipline.

#### Ensembles:

- Bands, choirs, instrumental ensembles and string orchestras must use only bona fide members. A "bona fide" member is defined as a person who has been a practicing member of the ensemble for at least three consecutive months immediately prior to the festival performance.
- 2. In Choral classes with age restrictions, no more than 5% of the choir membership is permitted to exceed the age limit. No member can exceed the age limit by more than two years.
- 3. Choral conductors are not permitted to sing with their choirs.

#### **Copyright Issues:**

- 1. All copyrights regarding music must be observed. Contestants, accompanists and directors using unauthorized photocopies of copyrighted music will be disqualified from the class in question.
- 2. All contestants using e-print music must provide proof of purchase.

## **IMPORTANT NOTATIONS**

**ADJUDICATORS' PRIVACY POLICY:** At no time should participants, their families, or teachers approach an adjudicator to comment on a mark or an adjudication. Occasionally, adjudicators may have the time or flexibility to work individually with a performer who is moving on to Provincial Finals. This extra approach should only be at the adjudicator's request. Adjudicators are professionals who comment to the best of their abilities on the performances they have heard. Any concerns about an adjudication or mark should be addressed to the Coordinator in the form of a letter.

**OWN-CHOICE MUSIC** must be provided by the participant for the adjudicator. The music should be clearly labelled with the participant class number, participant number and name. It should be passed to the adjudicator's secretary (NOT directly to the adjudicator) prior to the beginning of the session or at the designated break.

**CONCERT GROUP PARTICIPANTS:** Concert Group participants please provide two (2) lists of pieces that will be performed - one for the adjudicator and the other for the co-ordinator, on the day of the performance.

**COMPLAINTS:** Any complaints regarding the Music Festival are to be addressed in writing to the coordinator of the Music Festival no later than one week after the Festival has been concluded. It should be noted that the decision of an adjudicator is final.

**MUSIC: NO UNAUTHORIZED PHOTOCOPIED MUSIC** will be accepted in any public place at this festival as it is illegal and subject to penalty by law. All music used must be originals.

## TO THE AUDIENCE

Absolute silence is required during competitions. It is requested that no one leave or enter while a competitor is performing.

Please ensure that cellular/mobile phones are turned off.

The use of cameras, tape recorders, or any other recording device is forbidden, as it is distracting to both the competitor and adjudicator.
