Marion Abbott

Vocal / Musical Theatre Adjudicator for Kings County Music Festival, 2025

Marion Abbott is a proud graduate of the Musical Theatre Performance Program at Sheridan College. Upon graduating, she was immediately hired to teach for the program and was later named one of the top twenty graduates of the program.

She has her A.R.C.T. in Piano Performance and Grade 10 Voice from The Royal Conservatory of Music. Marion has produced over 400 productions in Toronto and other cities. Of the many (many!) shows Marion has worked on, some of her favourites include *The Scarlet Pimpernel*, *All Shook Up, Anne And Maud, No Safe Harbour, Ragtime, Streetcar Named Desire and Passion*.

As a private teacher, Marion has taught voice, piano and acting for 35 years to students of all ages. From festivals to recitals to performances in Disney World, Marion cherishes dearly the memories of her time with her students.

## Magdalena von Eccher

Piano Adjudicator for Kings County Music Festival, 2025



Magdalena von Eccher is recognized as one of Canada's finest musicians. Her performances as solo pianist, with orchestra, collaborating with singers, and in chamber music are earning the highest praise from fellow musicians and are loved by audiences. Magdalena's musical communication is always personal, poetic, and of the highest artistic calibre. Along with her performing career she is sought after as an engaging and skilled teacher and adjudicator, having been on faculty at the University of Lethbridge Department of Music and at McGill University's Schulich School of Music. She is now based in Charlottetown, PEI as Assistant Professor of Piano at the University of Prince Edward Island.

Her studies were completed at the University of Lethbridge (awarded the Faculty of Fine Arts Gold Medal), the

University of British Columbia, and McGill University with distinguished Canadian pianists Glen Montgomery, Jane Coop, and Stéphane Lemelin. Her doctoral research, supported by the prestigious Joseph-Armand Bombardier Graduate Scholarship from the Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council of Canada, focused upon the late Piano Sonatas of Viktor Ullmann. Having an affinity for vocal repertoire, Magdalena has studied with esteemed collaborative artists Michael McMahon (McGill University) and Rena Sharon (UBC). Participation in summer programs at Orford, Vienna, Salzburg, as well as a residency at the Banff Centre were generously supported through scholarships from her respective universities, the Strauss Foundation, and the Alberta Foundation for the Arts.

Magdalena's performing career has taken her from Vienna and Salzburg to Toronto and Montréal. Recent engagements have included numerous appearances in her new surroundings in Atlantic Canada as well as performances at McGill's Musical Chairs Chamber Music Festival with clarinetist, James Campbell and violist, Kim Kashkashian, the Canadian Opera Company in Toronto with soprano, Anna-Sophie Neher, concerto performances with the Lethbridge Symphony Orchestra, the Rocky Mountain Symphony Orchestra, and chamber performances with members of the PEI Symphony Orchestra. Since 2007, Magdalena has enjoyed invitations to the Festival of the Sound in solo performances as well as in collaboration with musicians such as Denis Brott, Cameron Crozman, Marion Newman, James Somerville, and visual artist, Alan Stein.

## TROPHIES, AWARDS AND SCHOLARSHIPS

To qualify for a festival award or scholarship, a solo contestant (except Pre-Juniors) must compete in more than one class in the same discipline when there is a provision of suitable classes in the same discipline from which to choose. To be eligible for an award, competitors must attain an average of at least 85% based on their top two marks or be recommended by the adjudicator for an award. Awards may be given to those attaining the highest marks in Sight Reading, Quick Study, Duet and Trio Classes in any discipline. Special Festival Awards may be given upon the recommendation of the adjudicators. All awards will not necessarily be given in any one year.

#### Conditions for Bursary as follows:

- 1. Solo performers graduating from high school who intend to make music a career are eligible.
- 2. This scholarship is open to residents of Kings County Music Festival area.
- 3. Performers must apply, in writing; the applicant's career goals, Music Festival experience and other relevant information should be included.
- 4. Those applying must be competing in the current annual Festival.
- 5. Applicants must achieve a mark of 85% or over to be eligible for this scholarship.
- 6. The scholarship will be awarded on the recommendation of the adjudicator in consultation with the Award Committee.
- 7. The scholarship shall be in the amount of \$600.00.
- 8. If sufficient funds are available, more than one scholarship may be given. If more than one person is eligible, this scholarship may be divided.
- 9. This scholarship is given for future tuition and related expenses. Payment will be made to accredited music schools. Special circumstances for study will be considered.
- 10. The scholarship will be presented following acceptance and registration in an accredited music program. The scholarship must be used within three years from date of presentation unless an extension is arranged with the Association.
- 11. Scholarship need not be presented every year.
- 12. Conditions of the scholarship may be subject to change from year to year.
- 13. APPLICATIONS MUST BE RECEIVED BY APRIL 15 OF THE CURRENT YEAR.

# Local and Provincial Festival Regulations

The Provincial Festival Board is responsible for creating and enforcing the regulations contained herein. The regulations govern all four affiliated local festivals, as well as the provincial festival. The purpose of the regulations is to ensure that:

(i) PEI festivals adhere to common standards;

and

(ii) festival competitions are conducted in a fair and equitable manner.

The four local festival organizing committees are responsible for the working management of local festivals. Please consult your local festival addendum for additional rules specific to your festival.

Performers, teachers, and parents are responsible for reading and complying with the regulations and entering the correct classes; non-compliance may result in disqualification. For the purpose of festival competition, disqualification means the performer will receive a written adjudication only (they will not be eligible to receive any award, or be recommended to provincial or national level)

#### Adjudication system:

- 1. The adjudication system of the Prince Edward Island Kiwanis Music Festival Association is designed to recognize each participant for his or her own individual performance.
- 2. Whether the classes are competitive or non-competitive, each performance is adjudicated according to its own merit and not in comparison with others.
- 3. Each participant will receive positive instruction and encouragement.
- 4. For competitive entries at local festivals, a gold, silver, or bronze seal will be added to the adjudication sheet reflecting the standard achieved for that particular performance. This standard is pre-determined by the adjudicator.

The marks represented by the seals are as follows:

- Gold 88 or above,
- Silver 84-87,
- Bronze 80-83.

The mark itself will not be made public and is used solely in deciding final awards.

Adjudicators' decisions must be accepted as final. Performers, teachers, and parents are prohibited from approaching the adjudicator to discuss these issues.

#### **Eligibility:**

- 1. The PEI music festivals shall be open to <u>non-professionals</u> who are (i) Canadian citizens; or (ii) living or studying in the province.
- 2. A "non-professional" is defined as a person whose principal means of livelihood is not obtained from the performance of music in the particular discipline in which he or she is

competing. Musicians who are members of ACTRA, Equity or the American Federation of Musicians of the United States and Canada (AFM/AFofM) are considered to be professional. A competitor who qualifies as a professional for the purpose of a particular discipline may enter as an amateur in other disciplines.

3. Music Festival performers should compete in their designated home festival. For the purpose of these regulations, "home festival" is defined as the local festival that operates in the performer's place of residence and/or study. Performers who wish to compete in an alternate local festival must submit a request in writing to the <a href="mailto:Provincial Administrator">Provincial Administrator</a> (pei.kiwanismusicfestival@gmail.com) prior to the entry deadline, stating the reason for the request.

#### Competitive or Non-competitive?

- 1. Performers have the option of entering local festival classes on a competitive or non-competitive basis.
- 2. Any person or group interested in participating non-competitively may (i) enter designated "non-competitive" classes; or (ii) select the "non-competitive" option on the entry form. In each case, the performer will receive a written adjudication, but no seal.
- 3. Non-competitive entries do not qualify for awards and provincial festival.

#### Disciplines and age / level categories:

In the Provincial Festival, the disciplines are as follows:

- Vocal
- Musical Theatre
- Piano
- Strings
- Woodwind
- Brass

- Percussion
- Organ
- Guitar
- Choral
- Composition

#### Age categories:

At the <u>Provincial Festival</u>, the age categories for all disciplines are as follows:

Junior 11 years and under
 Intermediate 14 years and under
 Senior 18 years and under
 Advanced 30 years and under

In <u>local festivals</u>, some additional disciplines and age levels are listed in this syllabus, including:

- Pre-Junior (8 years and under)
- Adult / Older Beginner
- Graded and Open classes

<sup>\*</sup> Please note that some of these disciplines may not be offered in some Local Festivals. Please consult your local festival's addendum if you are unsure.

- 1. Only performers fulfilling the official Junior, Intermediate, Senior, and Advanced categories are eligible to be recommended to progress to the Provincial Festival.
- 2. The age of a performer in all classes shall be considered as of <u>DECEMBER 31<sup>st</sup> of the previous calendar year.</u>
- 3. Eligibility requirements for local festival awards and scholarships are determined by the local festival organizing committees. Performers are advised to consult their local festival addendum for the rules specific to their festival.
- 4. A solo performer entering a specific age category in a discipline must remain in that age category throughout the classes offered in the discipline.
- 5. A performer entering a specific graded category in a discipline must remain in that graded category throughout the classes offered in the discipline.
- 6. A solo performer who has won the provincial class in his/her age category and discipline for three consecutive years must advance to the next age category in that discipline the following festival year. This does not preclude the performer from competing in the lower age category in another discipline in the same local festival.

#### Entry to local festival:

- 1. Entry fees are set by each local festival and payable to the local festival at the time of entry. Without exception, all entry fees are non-refundable.
- 2. Entry for all local festivals should be done using the online entry form. If you wish to complete a paper copy instead, please contact the coordinator of your local festival. There may be an additional charge for this.
- 3. Forms must be fully and accurately completed by the performer, parent, and/or teacher.

#### Festival scheduling:

Special scheduling requests cannot be guaranteed to be accepted, but an urgent request should be made at the time of entry to:

- to the Local Festival Coordinator or Programmer (for Local Festivals)
- to the Provincial Festival Administrator (for the Provincial Festival)

#### Selection choices:

- 1. Please read the specifications for your class very carefully to ensure you are entering eligible musical selections.
- 2. Some disciplines have age AND level-related requirements.
- 3. If you have ambitions to progress from your local festival, through the Provincial Festival, into the National Festival, please make sure that you enter the appropriate National Festival (NF) class at LOCAL festival level in order to fulfill the requirements of the National Festival Syllabus.
- 4. Changes in own choice selections or classes entered may not be made after entries are submitted without the permission of the local coordinator and the payment of a \$10.00 fee.

- 5. An entry submitted by one performer cannot be transferred to another performer.
- 6. A performer cannot perform the same selection in two consecutive years.
- 7. A performer cannot perform the same selection in more than one class.
- 8. If a performer is performing one movement of a multi-movement composition as an own-choice selection, he or she may perform another movement as a second own-choice selection
- 9. Original copies of music for own-choice selections must be supplied by performers. The class number and performer number must be clearly marked for the adjudicator. The first bar of each line must be numbered.
- The standard and suitability of own-choice selections will be given due consideration by the adjudicators.
- 11. A "concerted work" is defined as any composition originally written for solo instrument with orchestral /band accompaniment.

#### Performance regulations:

- Repeats in the score are generally omitted; however, the repetition of short sections may be observed to preserve the structure of the composition. All Da Capo and Dal Segno markings must be observed.
- 2. In all vocal classes, including choral classes, transposition one full tone up or down is permitted.
- 3. Memory work is encouraged in all festivals. No specific number of marks is allotted for memory work; memorized performances, however, will be given due consideration by the adjudicators.
- 4. Performers must provide their own accompanists and are responsible for any related costs incurred.
- 5. Long oral introductions in solo classes are not permitted in any discipline.

#### **Ensembles:**

- 1. Bands, choirs, instrumental ensembles, and string orchestras must use only bona fide members. A "bona fide" member is defined as a person who has been a practicing member of the ensemble for at least three consecutive months immediately prior to the festival performance.
- 2. In Choral classes with age restrictions, no more than 5% of the choir membership is permitted to exceed the age limit. No member can exceed the age limit by more than two years.
- 3. Choral conductors are not permitted to sing with their choirs.

#### Copyright Issues:

- 1. All copyrights regarding music must be observed. Performers, accompanists and directors using unauthorized photocopies of copyrighted music will be disqualified from the class in question.
- 2. All performers using e-print music must provide proof of purchase.

### Rules specific to Provincial Festival

1. The following may be recommended by Local Festival adjudicators for the Provincial Festival competition:

Not more than two solo performers per age category in each of the following disciplines:

Vocal

Organ

Woodwind

Composition

Musical Theatre

Strings

Brass

Piano

Classical Guitar

Percussion

Not more than two ensembles per category in each of the following disciplines:

• Chamber Ensemble

School Choir

Orchestra

• Community Choir

Band

2. Suggested levels for piano recommendations for the provincial festival are:

Junior (age 11 and under): Grade 2 to Grade 5
Intermediate (age 14 and under): Grade 5 to Grade 8
Senior (age 18 and under): Grade 8 to Grade 10

Advanced (age 30 and under): Advanced (majority of repertoire must be equivalent to ARCT /

Associate level)

- 3. Names of performers recommended to the Provincial Festival will be passed on to the Provincial Administrator, who will then contact all performers directly with details of the Provincial Finals, using the email address provided by the entrant on the Local Festival entry form. No separate registration is required.
- 4. Local festival adjudicators must sign all provincial festival recommendation forms.
- 5. Performers may be eligible for recommendation to the National Festival Competition from disciplines listed within the Provincial Syllabus. All performers hoping to be eligible for recommendation to the National Festival MUST have entered the relevant National Festival class at their Local Festival.
- 6. Provincial Festival performers must perform two contrasting selections in all disciplines except Junior Musical Theatre and Instrumental Ensemble. The selections must be chosen from repertoire performed by the contestant in the local festival. Recommendations on repertoire will be made by Local Festival adjudicator(s). The following proviso applies:

Senior and Advanced instrumentalists who wish to qualify for senior/advanced awards or be recommended for a stream in the National Festival may perform additional movements of multi-movement works performed in the Local Festival.

7. Performers must adhere to time limits specified in the class listing, or if not specified:

Junior: 12 minutes
 Intermediate: 15 minutes
 Senior: 40 minutes
 Advanced: 40 minutes

- 8. Requests for scheduling changes will not be considered.
- 9. Any urgent potential scheduling issues should be raised with the Provincial Administrator immediately at the point of recommendation from local festival.

# **IMPORTANT NOTATIONS**

ADJUDICATORS' PRIVACY POLICY: At no time should participants, their families, or teachers approach an adjudicator to comment on a mark or an adjudication. Occasionally, adjudicators may have the time or flexibility to work individually with a performer who is moving on to Provincial Finals. This extra approach should only be at the adjudicator's request. Adjudicators are professionals who comment to the best of their abilities on the performances they have heard. Any concerns about an adjudication or mark should be addressed to the Coordinator in the form of a letter.

OWN-CHOICE MUSIC must be provided by the participant for the adjudicator. The music should be clearly labelled with the participant class number, participant number and name. It should be passed to the adjudicator's secretary (NOT directly to the adjudicator) prior to the beginning of the session or at the designated break.

CONCERT GROUP PARTICIPANTS: Concert Group participants please provide two (2) lists of pieces that will be performed - one for the adjudicator and the other for the co-ordinator, on the day of the performance.

COMPLAINTS: Any complaints regarding the Music Festival are to be addressed in writing to the coordinator of the Music Festival no later than one week after the Festival has been concluded. It should be noted that the decision of an adjudicator is final.

MUSIC: <u>NO UNAUTHORIZED PHOTOCOPIED MUSIC</u> will be accepted in any public place at this festival as it is illegal and subject to penalty by law. All music used must be originals.

# TO THE AUDIENCE

Absolute silence is required during competitions.

It is requested that no one leave or enter while a competitor is performing.

Please ensure that cellular/mobile phones are turned off.

The use of cameras or any other recording device is forbidden, as it is distracting to both the competitor and adjudicator.
