About the PEI Music Festivals


The Prince Edward Island Kiwanis Music Festival Association (PEIKMFA) is the umbrella organisation for four local music festivals—**Kings County, Queens County, East Prince, and West Prince**—as well as the **Provincial Finals**.

Our festivals welcome **PEI music students and amateur musicians of all ages and backgrounds**, from beginners to advanced performers.

Most participants compete only at the local level, but those who wish may progress through **three stages of competition**:

1. **Local Festival**
2. **Provincial Festival**
3. **National Festival**

(details follow on the next few pages)



Local Festivals

Local Festivals take place at the beginning of May each year in four locations. This syllabus applies to all four local festivals (Kings County, Queens County, East Prince, and West Prince). For details on advancing to Provincial and National levels, please see separate sections below.

Entering Your Local Music Festival

1. Read the Rules and Regulations listed in this syllabus and on our website.
2. Check which is your closest Local Festival.
3. Read your local festival syllabus addendum (usually posted on the website in January) to find out specific requirements and fees for your area.
4. Check the entry deadline for your local festival.
5. Choose classes from this syllabus to enter. This syllabus is also online at www.peikmfa.ca.
6. If you hope to progress to the Provincial Festival (28 – 31 May 2026), make sure that you select appropriate material and have entered enough classes to make you eligible for consideration.
7. Read any Online Entry Form Guidance Notes posted on our website
8. Enter your Local festival using their online entry form (posted on the website in January)
9. Pay your entry fee (details for each festival is in the *Fees and how to pay them* documents on the website).

Important: If you wish to be considered for recommendation to the **National Festival**, you must:

- Review the National Festival requirements **before** entering your local festival.
- Ensure you meet eligibility criteria.
- Tick the box on your entry form indicating your interest in being considered.

Provincial Festival

The PEI Provincial Music Festival, held annually at the end of May, is the **final stage of the PEI festival season**. Top performers from all four PEI local festivals are invited to:

- Perform at a provincial level
- Compete for recognition and awards
- Receive expert feedback from our adjudicators

How to participate in the Provincial Festival

- **Enter at least two classes** at your local festival (selected from this syllabus) with repertoire meeting the required standard (where specified).
- **Receive a recommendation** from your local adjudicator.
- If recommended to the Provincial Festival, you will receive information and instructions from our Administrator using the email address(es) provided on the local festival entry form
- **It is the responsibility of the person completing the local festival entry form to ensure that the email provided is the best method of direct contact with the performer**, as communication needs to be received promptly due to the tight timeline between local results and provincial confirmation.

Additional Requirements for Senior and Advanced Performers (Voice and Musical Theatre only):

- **Three pieces of repertoire are required.**
- **This means entering either:**
 - **Three or more single-selection classes, or**
 - **One single-selection class plus one recital class (which includes two or more selections).**

Disciplines at the Provincial Festival:

• Vocal	• Brass	• Instrumental Ensemble
• Musical Theatre	• Woodwind	• Band
• Piano	• Percussion	• Choral
• Strings	• Classical Guitar	• Composition

Required Levels for Piano and Strings:

• Junior (11 & under)	RCM Level 2–5 or equivalent
• Intermediate (14 & under)	RCM Level 5–8 or equivalent
• Senior (18 & under)	RCM Level 8–10 or equivalent
• Advanced (30 & under)	Advanced repertoire

Cost: There is **no fee** to enter the Provincial Festival.

National Festival

The **National Music Festival**, hosted by the **Federation of Canadian Music Festivals (FCMF)**, takes place annually in **July**. It offers performers from across Canada the chance to:

- Perform at a national level
- Receive adjudication
- Participate in workshops

There are **three solo streams**, plus additional streams for ensembles and composers. Most events are virtual, but advanced soloists in the **Emerging Artists Stream** attend a five-day live festival.

Eligibility for the National Festival begins with the choices you make at the local and provincial levels, so please plan with this in mind. **If you do not meet the performance requirements at both stages, there is no pathway to the National Festival.**

How to participate in the National Festival:

- First, review the National Festival requirements carefully to understand the required repertoire at the local and provincial festivals. (See link to national festival syllabus below.)
- Next, enter classes from this syllabus in your local festival and tick the box indicating which National stream/level you wish to be considered for.
- You must be **recommended by adjudicators** at either the Local or Provincial level (depending on the stream).
- If recommended to the National Festival, you will receive information from our Administrator outlining how to complete your entry for the National Festival.

National Festival Streams Overview:

Solo Streams:

- **NCES (Non-Competitive Education Stream)** – Virtual
 - Ages 18 & under (14 & under for Vocal/Musical Theatre)
 - Level equivalent to RCM 4–7
 - Recommendation must be made by Local Festival adjudicator

- **Developing Artists Stream** – Virtual
 - Ages 18 & under
 - Level equivalent to RCM 8–10
 - Recommendation must be made by Provincial Festival adjudicator
- **Emerging Artists Stream** – Live
 - Ages 30 & under
 - Advanced level repertoire
 - Live competition at Mount Allison University, NB (25–29 July 2026)
 - Recommendation must be made by Provincial Festival adjudicator

Ensemble Streams:

- Choral and Instrumental classes (virtual)
- Recommendation must be made by Local Festival adjudicator
- Includes online workshops and conductor roundtables

Composition Streams:

- Solo/Duet or Ensemble
- Advanced, Intermediate, and Junior levels
- Virtual adjudication and workshops
- Recommendation must be made by Local Festival adjudicator

Cost:

Fees vary by stream. Payment is due at registration in late June. Local and provincial festivals may assist with costs.

LOCAL AND PROVINCIAL REGULATIONS

The Provincial Festival Board is responsible for creating and enforcing the regulations contained herein. The regulations govern all four affiliated local festivals, as well as the provincial festival. The purpose of the regulations is to ensure that:

(i) PEI festivals adhere to common standards;

and

(ii) festival competitions are conducted in a fair and equitable manner.

The four local festival organizing committees are responsible for the working management of their respective festivals. Please consult your local festival addendum for additional rules specific to your festival.

Performers, teachers, and parents are responsible for reading and complying with the regulations and entering the correct classes; non-compliance may result in disqualification. For the purpose of festival competition, disqualification means the performer will receive a written adjudication only (they will not be eligible to receive any award, or be recommended to provincial or national level)

Adjudication system:

1. The adjudication system of the Prince Edward Island Kiwanis Music Festival Association is designed to recognize each performance on its own merits.
2. Whether the classes are competitive or non competitive, performances are evaluated individually and not in comparison with others in the same competition.
3. Positive instruction and encouragement will be provided for each performance.
4. For competitive entries at local festivals, a gold, silver, or bronze seal will be added to the adjudication sheet reflecting the standard achieved for that particular performance. This standard is pre-determined by the adjudicator.

The marks represented by the seals are as follows:

- Gold 88 or above,
- Silver 84-87,
- Bronze 80-83.

The mark itself will not be made public and is used solely in deciding final awards.

Adjudicators' decisions must be accepted as final. Performers, teachers, and parents are prohibited from approaching the adjudicator to discuss these issues.

Eligibility:

1. The PEI music festivals shall be open to non-professionals who are (i) Canadian citizens; or (ii) living or studying in the province.
2. A “non-professional” is defined as a person whose principal means of livelihood is not obtained from the performance of music in the particular discipline in which he or she is competing. Musicians who are members of ACTRA, Equity or the American Federation of Musicians of the United States and Canada (AFM/AFofM) are considered to be professional. A competitor who qualifies as a professional for the purpose of a particular discipline may enter as an amateur in other disciplines.
3. Music Festival performers should compete in their designated home festival. For the purpose of these regulations, “home festival” is defined as the local festival that operates in the performer’s place of residence and/or study. Performers who wish to compete in an alternate local festival must submit a request in writing to the [Provincial Administrator \(pei.kiwanismusicfestival@gmail.com\)](mailto:Provincial Administrator (pei.kiwanismusicfestival@gmail.com)) prior to the entry deadline, stating the reason for the request.

Competitive or Non-competitive?

1. Performers have the option of entering local festival classes on a competitive or non-competitive basis.
2. Any person or group interested in participating non-competitively may (i) enter designated “non-competitive” classes; or (ii) select the “non-competitive” option on the entry form. In each case, the performer will receive a written adjudication, but no seal.
3. Non-competitive entries do not qualify for awards or provincial / national festival recommendation.

Disciplines and age / level categories:

In the Provincial Festival, the disciplines are as follows:

<ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ Vocal▪ Musical Theatre▪ Piano▪ Organ▪ Strings▪ Instrumental (Woodwind, Brass, Percussion)	<ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ Classical Guitar▪ Choral▪ Ensembles▪ Band▪ Composition
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** Please note that some of these disciplines may not be offered in some Local Festivals. Please consult your local festival's addendum if you are unsure.*

Other disciplines are on offer at Local level only, including Recorder, Ukulele, and Bagpipes.

Age categories:

At the Provincial Festival, the age categories for all disciplines are as follows:

- Junior 11 years and under
- Intermediate 14 years and under
- Senior 18 years and under
- Advanced 30 years and under

In local festivals, some additional disciplines and age levels are listed in this syllabus, including:

- Pre-Junior (8 years and under)
- Adult / Older Beginner
- Graded and Open classes

1. Only performers fulfilling the official Junior, Intermediate, Senior, and Advanced categories are eligible to be recommended to progress to the Provincial Festival.
2. The age of a performer in all classes shall be considered as of DECEMBER 31st of the previous calendar year.
3. Eligibility requirements for local festival awards and scholarships are determined by the local festival organizing committees. Performers are advised to consult their local festival addendum for the rules specific to their festival.
4. A solo performer entering a specific age category in a discipline must remain in that age category throughout the classes offered in the discipline.
5. A performer entering a specific Graded category in a discipline must remain in that Graded category throughout the classes offered in the discipline.
6. A solo performer who has won the provincial class in his/her age category and discipline for three consecutive years must advance to the next age category in that discipline the following festival year. This does not preclude the performer from competing in the lower age category in another discipline in the same local festival.

Entry to local festival:

1. Entry fees are set by each local festival and payable to the local festival at the time of entry. Without exception, all entry fees are non-refundable.
2. Entry for all local festivals should be done using the online entry form. If you wish to complete a paper copy instead, please contact the coordinator of your local festival. There may be an additional charge for this.

3. Forms must be fully and accurately completed by the performer, parent, and/or teacher. Incomplete forms will not be accepted. The forms must contain the following information:
 - full titles of ALL selections, including names of movements, if applicable
 - PERFORMANCE TIME (round UP to the nearest minute) of each selection
 - complete names of composers
 - name of accompanist
 - number of members in an ensemble or group
4. A performer who withdraws from a programmed class must notify the local festival coordinator prior to the festival.

Festival scheduling:

Scheduling is done separately for each festival.

Special scheduling requests cannot be guaranteed to be accepted, but any urgent request should be made at the time of entry to:

- to the Local Festival Coordinator or Programmer (for Local Festivals)
- to the Provincial Festival Administrator (for the Provincial Festival)

Selection choices:

1. Please read the specifications for your class very carefully to ensure you are entering eligible musical selections.
2. Some disciplines have age AND level-related requirements.
3. If you have ambitions to progress from your local festival, through the Provincial Festival, into the National Festival, please make sure that you check the appropriate box on your LOCAL festival entry form and make sure that your entry fulfills the requirements of the [National Festival Syllabus](#).
4. Changes to own choice selections or classes entered may not be made after entries are submitted without the permission of the local coordinator and the payment of a \$10.00 fee.
5. An entry submitted by one performer cannot be transferred to another performer.
6. A performer cannot perform the same selection in two consecutive years.
7. A performer cannot perform the same selection in more than one class.
8. If a performer is performing one movement of a multi-movement composition as an own-choice selection, he or she may perform another movement as a second own-choice selection
9. **Original copies of music must be supplied for both the adjudicator and the accompanist.**
10. **For e-print music, proof of purchase must also be provided.**

11. The class number and performer number must be clearly marked for the adjudicator. The first bar of each line must be numbered.
12. The standard and suitability of own-choice selections will be given due consideration by the adjudicators.
13. A “concerted work” is defined as any composition originally written for solo instrument with orchestral /band accompaniment.

Performance regulations:

1. Repeats in the score are generally omitted; however, the repetition of short sections may be observed to preserve the structure of the composition. All Da Capo and Dal Segno markings must be observed.
2. In all vocal classes, including choral classes, transposition one full tone up or down is permitted.
3. Memory work is encouraged in all local festivals. No specific number of marks is allotted for memory work; memorized performances, however, will be given due consideration by the adjudicators.
4. Performers must provide their own accompanists and are responsible for any related costs incurred.
5. Long oral introductions in solo classes are not permitted in any discipline.

Ensembles:

1. Bands, choirs, instrumental ensembles, and string orchestras must use only bona fide members. A “bona fide” member is defined as a person who has been a practicing member of the ensemble for at least three consecutive months immediately prior to the festival performance.
2. In Choral classes with age restrictions, no more than 5% of the choir membership is permitted to exceed the age limit. No member can exceed the age limit by more than two years.
3. Choral conductors are not permitted to sing with their choirs.

Copyright Issues:

1. All copyrights regarding music must be observed. Performers, accompanists and directors using unauthorized photocopies of copyrighted music will be disqualified from the class in question.
2. All performers using e-print music must provide proof of purchase. **Original copies of music** for own-choice selections **must be supplied by performers.**

Rules specific to Provincial Festival

1. The following may be recommended by Local Festival adjudicators for the Provincial Festival competition:

*Not more than **two** solo performers per age category in each of the following disciplines:*

- Vocal
- Musical Theatre
- Piano
- Organ
- Strings
- Classical Guitar
- Woodwind
- Brass
- Percussion
- Composition

- b. Not more than **two** ensembles per category in each of the following disciplines:

- Chamber Ensemble
- Community Choir
- School Choir
- Band
- Orchestra

2. Levels for Piano and String recommendations for the provincial festival are:

Junior (age 11 and under):	Level 2 to Level 5
Intermediate (age 14 and under):	Level 5 to Level 8
Senior (age 18 and under):	Level 8 to Level 10
Advanced (age 30 and under):	Advanced

3. Names of performers recommended to the Provincial Festival will be passed on to the Provincial Administrator, who will then contact all performers directly with details of the Provincial Finals, using the email address provided by the entrant on the Local Festival entry form. No separate registration is required.
4. Local festival adjudicators must sign all provincial festival recommendation forms.
5. At Provincial level, performers may be eligible for recommendation to the National Festival Competition from disciplines listed within the Provincial Syllabus. All performers hoping to be eligible for recommendation to the National Festival MUST have checked the appropriate box on the entry form, and have entered at least 2 eligible classes at their Local Festival (at least 3 for voice and musical theatre) and be recommended to the Provincial Festival by the Local Festival adjudicators.
6. Provincial Festival performers must perform **two** contrasting selections in all disciplines **except** Junior Musical Theatre and Instrumental Ensemble (1), and Advanced level Voice and Musical Theatre (3). The selections must be chosen from repertoire performed by the contestant in the local festival. Recommendations on repertoire will be made by Local Festival adjudicator(s). The following proviso applies:

Senior and Advanced instrumentalists who wish to qualify for senior/advanced awards or be recommended for a stream in the National Festival may perform additional movements of multi-movement works performed in the Local Festival.

7. Performers must adhere to time limits specified in the class listing, or if not specified:
 - Junior: 12 minutes
 - Intermediate: 15 minutes
 - Senior: 40 minutes
 - Advanced: 40 minutes
8. Performance by memory is required in Piano, Strings (except Sonatas), Voice and Musical Theatre class at Provincial level.
9. A provincial competition schedule outline will be available in early May to help performers recommended to Provincials prepare and plan. Any performers who have an urgent scheduling issue should notify the Provincial Administrator immediately after being recommended from their local festival. Special scheduling requests can't be guaranteed, however. Once the schedule is finalized, requests for scheduling changes will not be considered.

SYLLABUS

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NEW FOR 2026

All disciplines:

- **No National Festival classes.**
Performers wishing to be considered for National Festival recommendation should read pages 6-7 of this syllabus carefully and ensure they have selected the correct number and type of classes to make them eligible for National recommendation.
- Additional classes to enable **ensembles** to enter 2 classes at local level (required for National Festival eligibility)

Strings only:

- All Strings are now combined into one set of classes (there are no longer classes specifically for violin, viola, cello, and bass)
- More specific levelling criteria for repertoire in Masterwork classes

CHORAL AND VOCAL ENSEMBLE CLASSES

PROVINCIAL FESTIVAL ELIGIBILITY

Ensembles performing **2 or more pieces** of suitable repertoire, are eligible for recommendation to the Provincial Festival finals by Local Festival adjudicators.

Please see the Provincial Festival section on page 5 of the syllabus for more information.

NATIONAL FESTIVAL ELIGIBILITY

Eligible ensembles may be recommended to **National Music Festival Ensemble Classes** (recorded stream) by the adjudicator(s) at the Provincial finals.

Groups wishing to be considered for National Festival recommendation MUST indicate this by checking the appropriate box on their Local Festival entry form.

Please see the National Festival section on page 6-7 of this syllabus for details of the requirements for National Festival eligibility.

School Groups & Choirs

Information applying to ALL school groups / choirs

(additional information may be specified for some classes)

- **Two** own choice selections of contrasting nature (Exception: Concert Groups must select **THREE**)
- May be entered competitively or non-competitively
- May be school choirs at specified grade levels or combination of school classes of specified grade levels. (Example: all your Grade 1 classes, etc.)
- Split classes must enter the highest listed class for their level: Example split 3/4 class would enter Grade 4.
- May be sung in any language unless specified.
- Repertoire must be named on the entry form.
- **Performers must provide the adjudicator with a legal copy of the music.**
- No photocopied music is allowed at this Festival. E-printed music must have proof of purchase.
- Please **time repertoire** carefully and round UP to the nearest minute to specify on entry form
- Please specify the number of members on entry - not to exceed 110
- Only bona fide choir members may participate (See Regulations 1 & 2 under the section "Ensembles" on page 12)
- Performers **must not** perform the same selection more than once.
- Performers should refer to their Local Festival Addendum for information and criteria on awards.
